## **CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE TO LIST UNITED ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE AS AN ADDITIONAL INSURED**

**“Application and Agreement for Interconnection and Net Metering of Renewable Energy Systems  
Page 7 Paragraph 17. Liability Insurance.**

...Member-Generator have no less than \$100,000 of coverage so long as the Member-Generator’s System is interconnected with Cooperative’s electrical system so as to provide coverage for all risk of liability for personal injuries (including death) and damage to property arising out of or caused by the operation of Member-Generator’s System. ...Member-Generator will upon request, furnish Cooperative with a certificate of insurance evidencing such coverage and naming Cooperative as an additional insured.”

For those solar systems sized at 10 kW or less we will accept being listed only as a Certificate Holder to be kept aware the policy is in force instead of requiring an endorsement as an additional insured.

### **P.S. Further Explanation:**

**Additional Insured** and **Additional Interest** are often used interchangeably in contractual language. An **additional insured or interest** has a vested “**interest**” in the item or property being **insured** but has no actual ownership of it. When requiring to be listed as additional insured, then that is stated on the certificate and United Electric Cooperative agrees to honor the contractual agreements which may state, that if UECE is negligent, our UECE insurance will be primary up to stated limits.

Per Missouri Net Meter statute, United Electric requires to be listed as an additional insured for systems over 10 kW even if that means the customer must be charged more or change insurance companies, or else the Net Meter Application will be denied. UECE supports our member/customer decision to install solar/wind generation up to their monthly load but the liability insurance requirement must be met.
